For the first time, us Haitian-Americans went to Congress and set in motion an all new concept of the Haitian place, in America, as citizen.**

**We are now in 2002, in the 21st Century, yet we do not have a MAJOR VOICE, anywhere in the United States of America. We do not vote. We do not try to be elected on local, states and federal offices, specially at Congress. Until we do, our voices will not be heard, we will be considered ABSENT.**

**With your new efforts, I believe, somehow, we finally will revitalize our constant demand for equality, justice, and equal employment opportunity for us, our children and grand children.**

**While I am with you, I would like you to pass this message around: As I am majoring in "Criminology " at Old Westbury College, SUNY University, at age 70, I was astonished to see, in the UCR (Uniform Crime Reports ) , young blacks, are in majority in American jails. Actually, the young black male is the most vulnerable person in American Society. I am asking you to pass the word around: PROTECT OUR YOUNG MALE. DO NOT LET THEM GO TO JAIL ANYMORE. IT IS ANOTHER TYPE OF GENOCIDE TO SYSTEMATICALLY REMOVE THEY YOUNG BLACK MALES FROM THE GOVERNMENTAL JOBS AND POLITICAL POSITIONS." Please spread the word around. Let's put a stop to that crime.**
